I am amongst the quiet majority who believe that our entire political establishment has shown utter contempt for the values my generation took for granted; such as the right to live in a democracy governed by its own laws and based on its own culture derived from Judeo Christian foundations. Moderates like me have stayed silent for too long in a culture of increasing 'Political Correctness' where secular minority groups of every kind dominate the national narrative.

As a young man of 20 in 1975 I voted to remain in the European Economic Community. With English and Polish parents, I was half Yorkshire, half European and thought anything that would increase friendship, economic cooperation and keep us from another terrible war had to be a good thing. We weren't told that joining the E.E.C. would mean losing vital industries, our unique British way of life and worse still, our freedom to choose who would govern us. There were voices then warning us from both sides of the political spectrum about this hidden agenda. We didn't listen.



Three and a half years on from the E.U. Referendum, we're weary, but there's something vital at stake in this, the most important general election of our lifetime: it is the question of who governs us, because the 17.4 million who voted leave want it to be us, the British, but in cooperation with our friends and trading partners in Europe.

Conservatives want us all to believe Boris did a good 'deal' with the E.U. Actually, it's an international treaty, binding in law – of a kind a nation only signs after losing a war. How sad that Britain which once proudly stood alone as European nations fell victim to tyranny should be reduced to little more than a vassal province of a European super state.
